



**Cabinet's security committee meets to weigh India's options after Uri attack**

New Delhi, Sept. 21 – PM Narendra Modi met on Wednesday his top ministers and military commanders to agree a response to a deadly weekend attack on an army camp in Kashmir that the government has blamed on militants based in Pakistan.

New Delhi, Sept. 20 -- India moved on Monday to diplomatically isolate Pakistan as part of retaliation to a militant attack on an army base in Kashmir, but the plan appeared set to run into a wall of resistance from a defiant Islamabad.

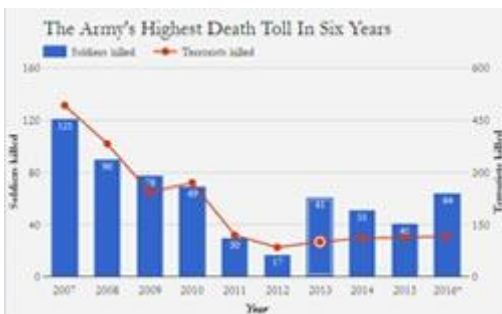
**Uri militants came in army uniforms, cut through the fence to reach camp**



New Delhi, Sept. 20 -- The four militants who carried out the audacious Uri strike that left 18 soldiers dead wore fatigues, entered the army base by cutting the fence and knew their way around the military complex, sources said.

**Uri attack: Army death toll this year in J-K jumps to 64; highest in 6 years**



New Delhi, Sept. 19 -- With 18 soldiers dying in a pre-dawn terrorist attack in North Kashmir's Uri area on Sept 18, 2016, the army's combat death toll in J&K is 64 this year (until September 18), the highest since 2010, when 69 soldiers died, according to the South Asia Terrorism Portal (SATP)

In contrast, civilian casualties along the line of control (LoC)—the de facto border between India and Pakistan in J&K—in 2016 were the lowest in three decades, SATP data reveal. About 800 civilians died every year, on average, between 1990 and 2007.

Over the last three decades, the 20-year period between 1990 and 2010 was the most violent, while the period after 2011 relatively more peaceful, according to the SATP data.
