World Bank CEO arrives in India to oversee various projects

New Delhi, March 1, 2017 -- World Bank's Chief Executive Officer Kristalina Georgieva arrives today in India on her first official visit to oversee various projects and discuss further opportunities of co-operation. Ms Georgieva will meet senior leaders at a time, when the country's economic growth is one of the bright spots in the global economy. 'India is our biggest middle income client. Its economic growth influences global growth. Its achievements in health and education contribute to the world achieving the Sustainable Development Goals,' she said. 'I am keen to learn more as India is a laboratory for the world to learn about what works in development and to find new ways to collaborate,' the CEO of World Bank added.

Ms Georgieva will hold discussions with Minister of Finance Arun Jaitley and other key policy-makers. She will also meet with Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Governor of Reserve Bank of India, Urjit Patel.

The CEO will be accompanied by Annette Dixon, World Bank Vice President for South Asia.

Arun Jaitley pitches for higher World Bank funding, lower rates

World Bank arm to invest \$47.5 million in Granules India



New York, USA, Feb, 21, 2017 -- International Finance Corp. (IFC), the private-sector lending arm of the World Bank, on Monday said it will provide debt of \$47.5 million (Rs318 crore) to drug maker Granules India Ltd to help finance its investment plans. Granules India is building a bulk drug manufacturing facility in Vishakhapatnam, expanding its existing capacities and investing in research and development to make products with higher value addition. The total investment required is estimated at about \$84 million, with debt of \$68.5 million, including IFC's contribution.
